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The International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO) back in Chiba after 20 years

The International Mathematics Olympiad, attended by 618 high school students representing 112 countries and regions around the world, was held from Sunday, July 2, 2023, to Wednesday, July 12, 2023, at Makuhari Messe in Chiba.

The International Mathematics Olympiad, which began in Romania in 1959, had seven participating countries at the time, while Japan's first participation was in China in 1990. The number of participating countries has steadily increased throughout the years. This time, the Japanese team accomplished an outstanding result, with all six members receiving medals and placing sixth in the national ranking.

The Mathematics Olympiad Foundation, Chiba Prefecture, Chiba City, and Nippon Travel Agency, as well as the venues Hotel Nikko Narita, APA Hotel & Resort Tokyo Bay Makuhari, and Makuhari Messe, were involved in inviting and sponsoring the tournament.

This year's event came six years after the Chiba Convention Bureau began its effort to bring the Olympiad to Chiba in 2017.

Post-Olympiad Activities

The International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO) is held every year, with different countries taking turns hosting. It has been over 20 years since Japan hosted the last in 2003; therefore, it was requested that Japan compete at the 2017 IMO in Brazil. The following year, in July 2018, the IMO Romania Convention officially announced that the 64th International Mathematics Olympiad (IMO2023) would be held in Japan.

As part of the services offered by the Chiba Convention Bureau (CCB), meeting rooms for management discussions and mediation between organizers and hotels hosting the tournament were provided. During the tournament, 47 volunteers were organized to support each participant from various countries and regions. Various activities evolving local groups and universities were incorporated into the program, in addition to various culture-related programs such as tea ceremonies, mosaic puzzles, origami, etc.

The first day of the 2-day excursion program brought participating students to Tokyo Disneyland, followed by technical visits on the second day. Being able to tour Japan's leading companies and research institutes seems to have stimulated the intellectual curiosity of the athletes from each country. Through the Chiba Convention Bureau's assistance, various support and subsidies were also granted to the Olympiad.



The IMO Japan Convention Preparation Committee was formed in April 2017. After multiple deliberations on deciding the venue, Chiba was deemed to have the most convenient access for international participants, with Tokyo, Narita International Airport, and Haneda International Airports just nearby. Makuhari Messe in Chiba City was then selected as the competition venue.



The 9th International Discussion Meeting on Relaxations in Complex Systems (9IDMRCS)

The most prestigious international conference on various physical properties of physics, the 9th International Discussion Meeting on Relaxations in Complex Systems (9IDMRCS), was held for the first time in Japan from August 12th to 18th at Makuhari Messe, the first ever meeting that was held outside of Europe. It was attended by over 600 people from 39 countries worldwide.

Through the Chiba Convention Bureau's (CCB) assistance, the meeting has successfully granted special support from the Japan Tourism Agency, allowing full subsidy support for holding a banquet party at exclusive venues in Chiba, in this case, Mihama-en Japanese Garden, and a monitored tour program to the Chiba City Museum of Art. The banquet party held at Mihama-en is the first attempt to utilize the facility space as a party venue. The place was decorated to have a "summer festival" ambiance; food, drinks, and game booths and live entertainment awaited guests. The food was produced locally, while alcoholic drinks came from local breweries. In addition to utilizing local products and implementing various measures during the meeting, the CCB and the organizers have been mindful of various sustainable initiatives throughout.

The meeting also showcased post-convention tours to three different locations, namely, the Tokyo Tour, the Mt. Nokogiri Tour, and the Sawara Tour. Each tour features amazing sightseeing destinations, dining, shopping experiences, and more.

It has been a great experience for the Chiba Convention Bureau to be part of these prestigious events, and we are optimistic about the positive result of the experience and how it will carry forward to improve future services in hosting international events.

JNTO Incentive Travel Business Meetings An opportunity to reconnect and accelerate

With the aim of providing Japanese sellers with a common ground for reconnecting with international clients, the Japan National Tourism Organization (JNTO) holds various seminars abroad.

After years of stagnation due to the pandemic, the Chiba Convention Bureau (CCB) anticipates participating in various seminars and business talks to reconnect with former partners, meet new clients, and gather information that will lead to the development of hosting incentive groups in Chiba. This kind of gathering also serves as a platform to promote Chiba as a MICE destination through face-to-face consultations and presentations.

On August 31 and October 5, 2023, the CCB participated in the seminar and tradeshow organized by the JNTO in Singapore and Malaysia, respectively. A combined number of nineteen face-to-face business talks and fourteen company visits have been successfully made during these two occasions, along with some corporate visits and local site inspection tours. Indeed, it was a great opportunity to actually meet new people and those whom we had communicated with over the internet during the years of the pandemic.

It is said that people have different characteristics, and so does the market. So, knowing the client's needs makes a big difference in achieving a successful outcome. This kind of seminar or tradeshow provides an opportunity for our organization to gain actual knowledge about the market through actual dialogue and by experiencing the market firsthand. These claims serve as a foundation for formulating appropriate responses and developing capability in hosting respective groups. The Chiba Convention Bureau will continue to work hand-in-hand with our local governments, public and private organizations, academic institutions, and local enterprises to further improve services that will cater to international clients, as well as promote Chiba as a MICE destination for our international clients.

Promoting 'Chiba' in international market Full-scale travel and incentive promotion in Taiwan and Thailand

The Chiba Prefecture, together with the Chiba Prefectural Tourism and Local Products Association, the Chiba Convention Bureau, local government, and private enterprises, visited Taiwan and Thailand on July 9 and October 9, 2023, respectively. The visit aimed to promote Chiba as a travel and MICE destination. A total of 35 travel companies have been visited, and an additional 5 business exchanges have been made during the tours. In addition to travel companies, the group also visited publications, global companies, and media outlets to conduct market research and exchange opinions.

Since the ease of the Japan border restriction in 2022, the number of Taiwanese and Thai visitors to Japan has rapidly increased. Approximately 70% of the Taiwanese population travels overseas every year, and over 30% of them visit Japan, in addition to the extremely high rate of repetitive visitors to the country. On the other hand, Thailand is experiencing significant economic growth and is expected to see a further increase in the number of tourists visiting Japan, making Japan the fourth most visited destination after Laos, Malaysia, and Myanmar.

During business meetings, each representative from Chiba introduced the latest information relevant to the clients, such as information on tourism, new facilities, and special services, among others. For repeaters, one of the most sought-after areas are those unexplored places that are introduced on social media, as well as hands-on experiences and cultural interaction.

Undoubtedly, the number of visitors to Japan is on the rise, and the number of customers sent to Japan is steadily increasing. To cater to the needs of these clients, seek out new travel contents and supports offered by the local destinations. The market competition is intensifying, and it's the CCB's will to continue to carry out proactive promotional activities in collaboration with businesses in the prefecture and by leveraging the connections and networks built with key people locally.



La Festa Mille Miglia 2023 Grand Goal Ceremony held in Makuhari Bay Town in Chiba City

This year's marked the 26th year. La Festa Mille Miglia 2023 was held four days from October 6 to October 9, 2023, where the grand goal ceremony was held in Chiba City's Makuhari Bay Town.

Started in 1997, La Festa Mille Miglia is a classic car event where over 100 cars produced between 1919 and 1967 run the approximately 1,300km route from Tokyo and across eight prefectures of Japan.

Various tourist attractions and MICE facilities in Chiba have participated in the stamp rally, such as Kazusa Academia Park, Makuhari Messe, Naritasan Shinshoji Temple, Tokyo Disney Sea Hotel Mira Costa, the surfing competition venue for the Tokyo Olympic and Paralympic Games, and Tsurigasaki Coast, among others. The goal ceremony was held at Makuhari Bay Town. As part of Chiba's unique hospitality, participants were welcomed by a performance of the Chiba Prefecture Chiba Girls High School, and the checkered flag was waved by the Chiba Vice Mayor, Mr. Ohki. Indeed, this year's event marked another milestone in the hearts of each participant, with the promise of returning again next year.

La Festa Mille Miglia 2024 is scheduled to be held from September 27 to September 31. The Chiba Convention Bureau continued to actively work on attracting and supporting as many MICE events as possible within the prefecture and contributing to regional revitalization.


